## Measurements

The finished blanket measures approx. 200cm x 200cm.

## **Abbreviations**

ch - chain

ss - slip stitch

sp - space

dc - double crochet (US single crochet)

**tr** - treble crochet (US double crochet)

#### **Cluster Stitches**

**2 trcl** (2 treble clusters) Yarn over, insert hook in next space and pull up a loop, yarn over and pull through 2 loops (2 loops on hook). Yarn over, insert hook into same space and pull up a loop (4 loops on hook). Yarn over and pull through 2 loops (3 loops on hook). Yarn over and pull through all loops on the hook.

**3 trcl** (3 treble clusters) Yarn over, insert hook in next space and pull up a loop, yarn over and pull through 2 loops (2 loops on hook). Yarn over, insert hook into same space and pull up a loop (4 loops on hook). Yarn over and pull through 2 loops (3 loops on hook). Yarn over, insert hook into same space and pull up a loop (5 loops on hook). Yarn over and pull through 2 loops. Yarn over and pull through all loops on the hook.

As well as the written pattern, there will be picture tutorials for all the techniques required to complete this blanket. This pattern is suitable for all abilities.

## **Grace Blanket**

## **Starbursts**

Make 49 starburst circles using a 4mm hook and colours in the chart below.

**Round 1** Using 1<sup>st</sup> colour and 4mm hook, 3ch, ss to form a ring. 2ch (counts as 1tr). 11tr into ring, ss to join and fasten off. (12tr)

**Round 2** Using 2<sup>nd</sup> colour join in any space between trebles and 2ch. 1tr in same space (counts as 1<sup>st</sup> 2trcl) and 1ch. \* 2trcl, 1ch \* 11 times in each remaining sp, ss to join and fasten off (12 2trcl)

**Round 3** Using 3<sup>rd</sup> colour join in any space between 2trcl and 2ch. 2tr in same space (counts as 1<sup>st</sup> 3trcl) and 2ch. \* 3trcl, 2ch \* 11 times in each remaining sp, ss to join and fasten off (12 3trcl).

The central starburst is all cream. Rather than fastening off after each round, ss into space before commencing next round.

Make 49. Sew in all yarn ends.

# **Starbursts Colour Chart**


It's not essential to follow the colours in the chart but if you do you will achieve an ombre effect, starting light in the middle and getting darker at the edges. See page 1 for colour letters.

# Here is how I make my starbursts







- 1. **Round 1:** Using colour 1 and a 4mm hook, make a slipknot and 3ch.
- 2. Ss into first chain to form a loop and 3ch. The 3ch counts as the first treble. Now 11tr into the loop (marked by the arrow).
- 3. Insert your hook into the top of the first 3ch and pull a loop through to join.







- 4. Cut of the yarn, leaving a 10cm tail and pull through the loop to fasten off.
- 5. Your completed round 1 should look like this and have 12 'spokes' radiating out from the centre.
- 6. **Round 2:** Using colour 2, join by pulling a loop through the space between any of the trebles. Leave a 10-15cm tail.







- 7. 1ch using both yarn from the ball and the tail to secure.
- 8. 2ch using the yarn from the ball only.
- 9. 1tr in the same space and 1ch.







- 10. Complete round 2 using 2trcl (2 treble cluster stitches). Yarn over, insert hook into next space and pull up a loop. 3 loops left on your hook.
- 11. Yarn over again and pull through 2 loops. 2 loops left on your hook.
- 12. Yarn over and pull up a loop in the same space. 4 loops left on your hook.







- 13. Yarn over again and pull through 2 loops. 3 loops left on your hook.
- 14. Yarn over and pull through all 3 loops. 1 loop left on your hook. This forms the complete 2trcl stitch. Now 1ch and repeat in the remaining 10 spaces between trebles.
- 15. Insert your hook into the top of the first 3ch and ss to join as you did in round 1.







- 16. Round 3: Using colour 3, join in any 1ch space between clusters as you did in round 2 and 2ch.
- 17. Now make a 2trcl stitch in the same space as the 3ch and then 2ch.
- 18. You are now going to complete round 3 using 3trcl (3 treble cluster stitches). Yarn over and in the next space pull up a loop. 3 loops on your hook.







- 19. Yarn over and pull through 2 loops. 2 loops on your hook.
- 20. Yarn over, insert hook into same space and pull up a loop. 4 loops on your hook.
- 21. Yarn over and pull through 2 loops. 3 loops on your hook.







- 22. Yarn over, insert hook into same space and pull up a loop. 5 loops on your hook.
- 23. Yarn over and pull through 2 loops. 4 loops left on your hook.
- 24. Finally, yarn over and pull through all loops on hook to complete the 3trcl stitch. Now 2ch and repeat 18-24 in the remaining 10 spaces, ss to join and fasten off.








- 25. Now to deal with those pesky tails. Using the yarn needle, on the back, catch the yarn under one of the stitches of the previous round. Just go under the back of the stitch so you can't see it on the front.
- 26. Now insert the needle through the back of the cluster and pull the yarn through. Don't pull too tightly or you will distort the shape.
- 27. Now, skipping the first stitch of the cluster thread the yarn back the other way and snip off. Repeat for all the other ends.

# Joining the Starbursts with Continuous Join

The starbursts are joined in the order they appear in the chart on page 3. Joining begins at the bottom right-hand corner, marked S (start) and finishes at the top left-hand corner marked E (End). You will join from the bottom to the top of each row in turn. You will be using one continuous strand of yarn colour **A** and following the direction of join marked on the chart below.

DO NOT PANIC that the chart looks complicated. Once you understand how continuous join works you won't even need to look at the chart. This is explained fully in the next pages.

NB. For the purposes of the tutorial, I will be joining 9 starbursts. You will be joining all 49.



## **Continuous Join**







- 1. Lay out your starbursts in the order they appear in the chart on page 3. Starting with the bottom right corner starburst, using a 4mm hook, join colour A in any 2ch space and 3ch.
- 2. Now make 2 double trebles (2dtr) in the same space.

A dtr is a longer stitch that is used to form the corners and turn the circles into squares.

A double treble (**dtr**) is yarn over twice, insert hook and pull up a loop. Pull hook through 2 loops (3 loops left on hook). Yarn over and pull through 2 loops (2 loops left on hook). Yarn over and pull through 2 loops (1 loop left on hook).

3. In the next 2ch space, 3tr. Repeat in the next space. Then dtr in the next space 2ch.







- 4. In the same 2ch space 3dtr. This forms the corner.
- 5. Repeat on 2 more sides ending with 3dtr and 2ch. Don't turn the final corner. This is where we are going to join the next starburst.
- 6. Take the starburst that sits directly above the bottom right one on the chart on page 3. (You can see the direction we are joining on the chart on page 5.) Hold the starburst on top of the first one.







- 7. 3dtr in any 2ch space of the 2<sup>nd</sup> starburst.
- 8. Now turn the starburst through 180 degrees so the 3dtr you just made sits parallel with the previous one.
- 9. Now ss into the space between clusters above to join the two together.







- 10.3tr in the next 2ch space (on the starburst) and ss between clusters above. Repeat.
- 11. In the next 2ch space, 3dtr, 2ch, 3dtr to form a corner. There is no need for the corner to join the previous one. These will be joined later.
- 12. Continue working around the starburst until you have completed 3 sides ending with a 2ch, exactly as you did in step 5.







- 13. Now repeat step 6 with the remaining 5 starbursts in the first row, ending with a 3dtr and 2ch.
- 14. You will have a strip of 7 starbursts, all joined together on three sides. (Remember I'm only doing 3 for the tutorial)
- 15. Now to whizz down a long side. Turn the corner with 3dtr in the same space then 3tr in the next two spaces.







- 16. In the next space 3dtr, 2ch, then, ignoring the joining chains below, 3dtr in the next space. The chains don't need to join as this will happen when we join the next row of starbursts.
- 17. Repeat all the way down the strip until you get to the last corner. End with a 3dtr and 2ch.
- 18. Now take the starburst from the bottom of the next row on the chart and join with 3dtr as you did previously.







- 19. Now turn the starburst through 180 degrees so the 3dtr you just made sits parallel with the previous one and slst to join as before.
- 20.3tr in the next 2ch space (on the starburst) and slst between clusters above. Repeat. Now 3dtr.
- 21. Now join the corners together. Insert your hook down through the space between squares in the previous row and under the 2ch below it.







- 22. Make a ss to join.
- 23. 1ch to complete the join.
- 24. Complete the side, join the next starburst, and continue to join as previously.







- 25. You are going to join the final corner with two ss.
- 26. Make the first ss in the space between 3dtr's in the adjacent square.
- 27. Make the second ss between the 3dtr's of the square diagonally opposite. This makes a neat corner.







- 28. Now carry on with a 3dtr and proceed as previously. You now know how to join all corners.
- 29. Repeat the steps above until you have 7 rows of 7 starbursts. Stop when you get to the final long side as this is slightly different.
- 30. On the final long side, instead of 2ch and ignoring the 2ch below you can join these together by 1ch, slst into the space and 1ch.







- 31. The join on the edge should look like this.
- 32. Continue along the edge until you get to the corner. Turn the corner in the usual way and work along the bottom edge exactly as you did on the last long side.
- 33. When you get back to the first 3dtr, join with a ss in the top of the first 3ch. <u>Don't</u> break off the yarn. You can continue with the next round without rejoining.
- 34. You should now have your central panel of starbursts. Don't worry about the edges that have unjoined corners. These will be sorted out in the next round.

From now on the blanket is worked in rounds. To ensure it lays flat and does not begin to twist or skew, some rounds will be worked on the right side and some on the reverse. At the start of each round the pattern will state either **rsu** (right side up) or **rsd** (right side down). To make it easier to keep track of, I suggest attaching a piece of contrasting yarn to the right side



## Round 1 - rsu







- 1. You will start round 1 at the point where the continuous join ended with right side up (rsu).
- 2. Ss to the next space and 1ss in the space.
- 3. 2ch and then 2tr.







- 4. 3tr in next 2 spaces space. At the corner, 3tr, 2ch, 3tr. 3tr in the next 3 spaces.
- 5. To join the corners of the squares, work 1tr in the right-hand corner space.
- 6. Now work a tr2tog (decrease stitch) with the first half of the stitch in the right-hand corner space and the second half of the stitch in the left-hand corner space. To do this, yarn over and pull up a loop in the right-hand corner space. Yarn over and pull through 2 loops (2 loops on hook).







- 7. Yarn over and pull up a loop in left-hand corner space (4 loops on hook).
- 8. Yarn over and pull through 2 loops (3 loops on hook).
- 9. Yarn over and pull through 3 loops (1 loop on hook).







- 10. Complete the stitch by working 1tr in the left-hand corner space. Repeat this stitch at every point where two squares join in round 1, even those that are already joined with a ss.
- 11. The completed stitch will look like this. Don't worry that it dips down. This will square up later.
- 12. Continue working around the edge and ss to join. Do not break off the yarn.

**Round 2** – **rsd** Turn the work over so the right side is facing down. 2ch and then 2tr. Work 3tr in each space around the edge. At the corners work 3tr, 2ch, 3tr. When you have worked all the way around, join with a ss. Do not break off yarn.

From now on I will refer to these plain granny rounds as 'granny round'

Round 3 - rsu Work 1 granny round.

Round 4 - rsd Work 1 granny round.

**Round 5 – rsu** Work 1 granny round, join with a ss and fasten off yarn.

**Round 6** – **rsd** Join colour **B** in any space between 3tr. 2ch, 1tr. Now work 1ch, 2tr in each space around the edge. At the corners work 2tr, 3ch, 2tr. When you have worked all the way around, join with a ss and fasten off yarn.

Round 7 - rsu Join colour A in any space between ch and 2tr. Work 1 granny round.

Round 8 - rsd Work 1 granny round.

**Round 9 – rsu** Work 1 granny round.

Round 10 - rsd Work 1 granny round.

**Round 11 – rsu** Work 1 granny round, join with a ss and fasten off yarn.





This picture shows the pattern worked to the end of round 11. (Pink version to round 8) You should find that is now laying flat and should be completely square without the need for blocking. This section of the pattern can be used on its own to make a baby blanket. This size and shape can be adjusted by using a different number/ configuration of starbursts in the middle.  $7 \times 9$  squares is a popular size for a baby blanket.


#### Mini Grannies

**Round 12** – **rsu** Before starting to join your grannies, check you have the correct number of 3tr clusters. There should be 39 x 3tr clusters on each side.

This round consists of  $76 \times 2$  round granny squares and 4 special squares that will be joined in the shaded areas of the chart. These are actually rectangles and compensate for the fact that there are an odd number of clusters in this round. (It is not possible to have an even number of clusters in this round).

Start joining at one corner (Any corner of the blanket, it doesn't matter) and work around in a clockwise direction.

I used the following colours for each square: (first letter is the centre, 2<sup>nd</sup> letter is the outer round.)

Here is how to make and join your mini grannies, using 'join as you go'







- 1. Make your granny centre. This is done in the same way as the starburst Centre with the exception that it has additional chains to make 'corners'. So: 3 ch, ss to join and 2ch. 2tr into the loop and 2ch. \*3tr into the loop and 2ch\* 3 times. Ss to join and fasten off yarn. Sew in the tail in the very centre.
- 2. Join the second colour by threading it through the corner space and tying it tightly with a double knot. Notice I have tied it **over the top** of the previous tail.
- 3. Insert your hook into the corner space and pull up a loop.







- 4. 3ch, 2tr, 2ch, 3tr in the same space to make a corner. You are crocheting over the tails and the knot you have just made. The knot will be completely hidden.
- 5. Turn over and snip off the tails. There is no need to sew in. I have machine wash tested this method and it will not come undone.
- 6. In the next space 3tr, 1ch.







- 7. Insert your hook into the corner space of the blanket.
- 8. Ss to join the granny square to the blanket.
- 9. 3tr in the corner space of the granny square to form the corner.







- 10. Ss to join in the space between treble clusters on the blanket and 1ch.
- 11. Now complete the granny square in the usual way. Ss to join and fasten off yarn.
- 12. Repeat stages 1-6 with the next granny square.







- 13. Join to the previous square as indicated in the picture above.
- 14. In the next space, 3tr (don't ch 1 this time). You will join with two slip stitches in the spaces indicated by the arrows above.
- 15. It should look like this.







- 16. Complete the square in the usual way. Continue joining squares until you have 9 along the edge.
- 17. The rectangle centre is made in the same way as the square with the exception that two opposite sides have 4 tr instead of 3. So: 3 ch, ss to join and 2ch. 2tr into the loop and 2ch. 4tr into the loop and 2ch. 3tr into the loop and 2ch. 4tr into the loop and 2ch. Ss to join and fasten off yarn. Sew in the tail.
- 18. Join the second colour in the same way, 3ch and 2tr in the same space. 1ch







- 19. Ss to join to the corner of the last square.
- 20. Continue joining exactly as you did for the square, until you have turned the first corner. Snip off the tails as you did on the square.
- 21. Now, 3tr in the middle of the 4tr in the centre and ss to join the blanket. This is what turns the square into a rectangle.





- 22. Continue joining in the usual way. Remember, on the last side you will need to make 3 trebles between the 4 trebles in the centre to complete the rectangle.
- 23. It should look like this.

Continue working around the edge, following the square/ rectangle placement on the chart to complete round 12.





Round 13 – rsu Join colour A between two treble clusters in any mini granny. Do not join yarn where the squares are joined. 2ch and then 2tr. Now work tr2tog at the point where the next two squares join in exactly the same way as you did in round 1. Continue working around the blanket, remembering to tr2tog at every point where two squares join. At the corners work 3tr, 2ch, 3tr. When you have worked all the way around, join with a ss. Do not break off yarn.



**Round 14 – rsd** Work 1 granny round.

**Round 15 – rsu** Work 1 granny round.

Round 16 - rsd Work 1 granny round.

**Round 17 - rsu** Work 1 granny round.

**Round 18 – rsd** Join colour **B** in any space between 3tr. 2ch, 1tr. Now work 1ch, 2tr in each space around the edge. At the corners work 2tr, 3ch, 2tr. When you have worked all the way around, join with a ss and fasten off yarn.

Round 19 - rsu Join colour A in any space between ch and 2tr. Work 1 granny round.

Round 20 - rsd Repeat round 18.


Round 21 - rsu Join colour A in any space between ch,2tr. Work 1 granny round.

Round 22 - rsd Work 1 granny round

Round 23 - rsu Work 1 granny round.

Round 24 - rsd Work 1 granny round.

**Round 25 – rsu** Work 1 granny round, join with a ss and fasten off yarn.



#### **Starbursts**

**Round 26 – rsu** Before starting to join your starbursts, check you have the correct number of 3tr clusters. There should be 56 x 3tr clusters on each side.



This round consists of 60 starburst squares. These are worked in exactly the same way as the starbursts in the central panel, with the exception that the final round will be join as you go. This is the technique you used to join the mini grannies to the blanket in round 12. Start joining at one corner (doesn't matter which) and work around the blanket in a clockwise direction. All the starbursts in this round are the same size. There are no rectangles.

I used the following colours for each square: (first letter is centre, last letter is the outer joining round)

Round 27 – rsu Join colour A between two treble clusters in any starburst. Do not join yarn where the squares are joined. 2ch and then 2tr. Now work tr2tog at the point where the next two squares join in exactly the same way as you did in round 1. Continue working around the blanket, remembering to tr2tog at every point where two squares join. At the corners work 3tr, 2ch, 3tr. When you have worked all the way around, join with a ss. Do not break off yarn. (See page 11 for a reminder of how to do this if you need it)

Round 28 - rsd Work 1 granny round.

Round 29 - rsu Work 1 granny round.

Round 30 - rsd Work 1 granny round.

**Round 31 - rsu** Work 1 granny round.

**Round 32 – rsd** Join colour **B** in any space between 3tr. 2ch, 1tr. Now work 1ch, 2tr in each space around the edge. At the corners work 2tr, 3ch, 2tr. When you have worked all the way around, join with a ss and fasten off yarn.

Round 33 - rsu Work 1 granny round.

**Round 34 - rsd** Work 1 granny round.

**Round 35 – rsu** Work 1 granny round.

**Round 36 – rsd** Work 1 granny round.


**Round 37 - rsu** Work 1 granny round. Ss to join and fasten off yarn.

## **Mini Grannies**

**Round 38 – rsu** Before starting to join your grannies, check you have the correct number of 3tr clusters. There should be 75 x 3tr clusters on each side.

This round consists of  $148 \times 2$  round granny squares and 4 rectangles. This round is worked in the same way as round 12.

Start joining at one corner (Any corner of the blanket, it doesn't matter) and work around in a clockwise direction.



Join the mini grannies as indicated on the diagram. Join a rectangle in each shaded area as you did in round 12.

Round 39 – rsu (Same as round 13) Join colour A between two treble clusters in any mini granny. Do not join yarn where the squares are joined. 2ch and then 2tr. Now work tr2tog at the point where the next two squares join in the same way as you did in round 1. Continue working around the blanket, remembering to tr2tog at every point where two squares join. At the corners work 3tr, 2ch, 3tr. When you have worked all the way around, join with a ss. Do not break off yarn.

Round 40 - rsd Work 1 granny round.

Round 41 - rsu Work 1 granny round.

Round 42 - rsd Work 1 granny round.

Round 43 - rsu Work 1 granny round. Do not break off yarn.

## Round 44 - rsu Picot edge







- 1. 3ch, 1dc in the same space and then 3ch.
- 2. In the next space, 1dc, 3ch then 1dc again in the same space and 3ch. Repeat this in each space until you reach a corner.
- 3. At the corner, 1dc, 3ch and 1dc in the same space. Continue working around the edge and slip stitch to join. Sew in any remaining ends.





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
